Daryl Gates, 2015 Ohio AgriBusiness Association Educational Trust Honoree

Daryl Gates, today's honoree, was born and raised in Galion, Ohio, the fourth of five children of Boyd and Miriam Gates. Daryl met his future wife Valerie at Galion High School and they were married in 1973 while both were attending The Ohio State University. Daryl graduated from OSU's College of Business with a BS in Finance in 1974 and started his career soon after at Plant Life Services in Marion, Ohio.

After working at Plant Life for seven years
Daryl joined International Minerals and
Chemical (IMC) in 1981 and was soon
promoted to Regional Manager in the Chicago
area. After having their first two children Grant
and Brett, Daryl and Valerie decided to move
back to Marion in 1987 where Daryl would
take a position with Morral Chemical to help
Dick Fetter manage the company. In 1994 Daryl
helped arrange a joint venture sale for the
