

FROM LIFE-CHANGING TO WORLD-CHANGING: THE POWER OF GIVING BACK

Shirley Brooks-Jones' life was forever changed when her plane was diverted to Newfoundland, Canada on September 11th. She and her fellow passengers experienced the boundless hospitality of the locals, which in turn inspired the passengers to launch a scholarship initiative for the youth of the community. Shirley will share her story and inspire attendees to look for ways to give back to their own communities.

A native of Vinton County, Ohio, Shirley Brooks-Jones was a staff member at The Ohio State University for nearly 35 years, retiring with Emeritus status. Following her retirement, a good deal of Shirley's time has been devoted to volunteer activities, both long- and short-term. In addition, she has served as delegation leader for numerous international exchanges to dozens of countries on six continents. She has been inducted into the Ohio Agricultural Hall of Fame, the Farm Science Review Hall of Fame and the Vinton County 4-H Hall of Fame .


